### New Series 22 Safety Rail Cars

RCC22-1A, RCC22-2A, RCC22-3A

CE Certified to EN795:2012 Type D

Ronstan's CE Certified safety rail cars have long been the first choice of leading builders of superyacht and megayacht builders seeking to ensure a high standard of safety by specifying systems that are purpose designed, tested and standards-approved for protection against falls from a height. The latest design offers additional enhancements in terms of dynamic performance and inspection/maintenance procedures.

Fully compatible with Ronstan's Series 22 track rails, the latest generation of cars is certified to the EN795:2012 Type D standard.

The ergonomic spring-loaded plunger allows the car to be fixed in position at any of the stop holes along the track rail. Disengaging the plunger allows free movement of the car assembly along the rail. Forged bow shackles in Grade 316 stainless steel provide attachment points for personal protection gear lanyards.

Key features of the new generation of cars include:

- Ball bearings run in precision races within a fully machined, one-piece anodised aluminium car body to provide the user with exceptionally smooth mobility.
- Each car is identified with a unique serial number to facilitate accurate record keeping in relation to manufacture, delivery and installation of the cars, and logging of their individual inspection and maintenance history.
- The new design features a cut-out on each side of the car to allow visual inspection of the ball bearings, so that periodic inspections can be carried out without having to remove the car from its track rail.

The new cars are tested and certified to EN795:2012 Type D by Lloyd's Register in Copenhagen.
